Key Vocabulary

Alliteration – Dangerous Dolphins Discovered near Denmark!

Pun – Hungry clock goes back four seconds.

Strap Line – One line giving more information than the Headline, but not as much as the introduction.

Introduction – the opening of a text – includes the 5Ws.

Rhetorical Questions – questions asked to the reader to create effect.

Conclusion – the summing up of a text – revisiting key points of main paragraphs.

Sub-heading – an additional heading or title that is given to a paragraph.

Facts – statements that are proven to be true.

Quotes/Opinions – view or a belief that is not necessarily based on fact or knowledge, by an eye-witness.

Formal tone – a professional tone to a piece of writing (not chatty and casual).

Third person – written as if an outsider looking in (uses pronouns such as: he, she, it, they, him their etc).
